



Pastoral Reflection

A CALL TO A PROPHETIC LIFE

Today we are given a glimpse of what a prophet is. Ezekiel experiences what his call to be a prophet will entail. The psalmist describes the role of those who are called by GOD to be servants of the LORD, a role that includes rejection and mockery. St. Paul concludes his second letter to the faithful of Corinth describing how he has been faithful to his calling to be an apostle, announcing the Good News, in spite of the hardships he has had to endure. The Gospel presents Jesus returning to His hometown of Nazareth and the failure of the people to recognize His ministry because they think that they "know" him.

Living a prophetic life involves being attuned to God's will, guidance and purpose. Here are three key points to consider to be a prophet:

First, Spiritual Awareness: To be a prophet is to cultivate a deep spiritual connection and awareness of the Divine presence in your life. This involves practices such as personal prayer, preaching the Word of God, and reflection to align ourselves with the higher purpose.

Second, Integrity and Authenticity: To be a prophet is to live a life of integrity and authenticity. Staying true to your values and beliefs fulfills your sacred mission, even in the face of adversity. By embodying these principles, you become a vessel for Divine will to work through us.

Third, Service to Others: To be a prophet is to embrace a life of service to others, using your gifts of the three *T's* - *TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE* - to make positive impact to the world around us. By selflessly helping others and spreading love, justice and compassion, we fulfill our prophetic calling and bring light into the lives of those around us.

So, as a prophet by virtue of our baptism, our prophetic role means that we must be willing to cultivate a deep spiritual awareness and speak up for our relationship with Jesus and His *Abba*, in the unity of the Holy Spirit. It also implies that we must continue to work with integrity and authenticity through disciplines that include prayer, preaching, living the Gospel values, and service to others.

Personal challenge: Now, how many want to be a prophet?



The Bishop's Corner – Agrivoltaic System at the Vatican

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

Pope Francis gave a green light for work to start on building an agrivoltaic system on a Vatican property outside of Rome that could supply the whole of Vatican City's energy needs. "There is a need to make a transition to a model of sustainable development that reduces greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere, establishing the goal of climate neutrality," said the pope in an apostolic letter issued on his own initiative. The letter, titled "Brother Sun," was dated June 21, the summer solstice and the longest day of the year.

He wrote, "Humanity has the technological means needed to tackle this environmental transformation and its pernicious ethical, social, economic and political consequences, and among these, solar energy plays a key role. The future installation will be projected to ensure, not only the power supply of the radio station existing there, but also the complete energy support of Vatican City State."

Agrivoltaic systems are a series of solar panels that coexist with crops, livestock or both, such as by having panel arrays on top of greenhouses, interleaved among fields or elevated above them so they can still be used for agricultural purposes.

The Vatican has been seeking to drastically reduce its environmental impact by adopting more renewable energy sources, pursuing a goal of zero emissions by 2050.
