



Happy Azores & Portugal Day!

In continuation of our recognition of the wonderfully diverse cultures that make up the St. Patrick's Church family, this weekend



we are pleased to highlight our Portuguese parishioners in celebration of Azores Day on June 9 and Portugal Day on June 10! Azores Day, known in Portuguese as "Dia da Região Autónoma dos Açores," is a regional holiday observed annually on the day after Pentecost Sunday to celebrate the identity and pride of the Azorean people's culture and traditions. The history behind this day dates back to the Carnation Revolution in 1974, which led to significant political changes within the country, including regional autonomy for the archipelago. Various events are held throughout the island to mark the occasion, such as official government ceremonies, religious observances, and festivals with folklore music, dancing, and delicious cuisine. Portugal Day is a national holiday observed every year on June 10. On this day, tribute is paid to poet Luís de Camões, who is remembered for his famous poem about Portuguese explorations in the 15th century, which later became the national anthem. The government selects a different city each year to host the main celebrations, which include speeches, parades, concerts, and fireworks.

<u>The Bishop's Corner – Sacred Heart of Jesus</u>

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

In popular Catholic piety, each month of the year has become associated with a corresponding spiritual theme that focuses on various aspects of the Christian faith. June has become known in the last century as the Month of the Sacred Heart due to the fact that the feast of the Sacred Heart is celebrated each year during it. This year, this feast falls on Friday, 27th of June.

This was not always the case as the feast was not recognized until the 19th century. It all started when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received private revelations from Jesus Christ. Jesus spoke to her and asked her specifically to promote a feast that honored his Sacred Heart. *"I ask of you that the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special Feast to honour my heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to it by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which it has received during the time it has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that my heart shall expand itself to shed in abundance the influence of its Divine Love upon those who shall thus honour it, and cause it to be honoured."*

The entire purpose of this devotion is to draw a person closer to the heart of Christ. If a person spreads devotion to the Sacred Heart, it is natural for him or her to be closer to God.

Perhaps it would not harm us to add to our prayers in June a little invocation: "Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on me and hold me close in your heart."
