PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear friends,

St. Anthony was moved by the urge to spread the Gospel and to Evangelize. He wanted to go to Africa to preach the Gospel to those who never heard of Jesus Christ, instead he was sent to North Italy and to South France to preach to those who were abandoning the faith. In those days there were two dangers for the Faith: there was the Cathar Heresy, which was a strange religion, not really Christian, since they did not believe in the Trinity as revealed by the Bible and the Church and as it is professed today by many Churches, and did not consider marriage as a way of holiness, causing many people to abandon the family, wives, husbands and children. Then there was the rise of merchant society, that lead many people to abandon religious practice to dedicate their lives to accumulate more and more money. St. Anthony was sent to preach the Gospel to these people and he managed to convince many to return to faith in Jesus Christ and in the Trinity. He also was exhorting those who were still practicing the faith to live lives in sync with true Christian values, so that the Gospel of the Lord could be preached not only in Words, but even more through the witness of exemplary life. To do this he was sent to deepen his theological studies and to teach Theology to his Franciscan friars. He was the first follower of St. Francis who was involved with Theology. Today we are facing the same challenges, but in a stronger way. Our Church in Warwick is dedicated to St. Anthony, and as a Christian Community we are bound to carry on the Legacy of this great Saint. We cannot live our devotion to the saint just eating, drinking and with music and dances. We need to be true to Saint Anthony by carrying on his work to evangelize all those who are abandoning faith following false religions, not

rooted in Jesus Christ and in the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, and those who are too busy making business and money to think about God. Like Anthony we also need to know better our Faith and to live lives that are in sync with our faith, so that our words may be able to persuade and our way of life can speak when our words cannot speak anymore. THE BISHOP'S CORNER

My Dear Fellow-Catholics,

Today I would like to mention a Spanish missionary barbarously murdered in the Central African Republic a few weeks ago. She was beheaded and her body was then terribly mutilated.

Sister Inés Nieves Sancho was 77 years old and belonged to the Congregation of the Daughters of Jesus. In Africa, she spent most of her life teaching girls cutting and sewing. Her superiors had repeatedly requested that she return to Europe, but she always replied that she would remain with her people for as long as they needed her. Unidentified torturers stormed into her room at night and dragged her into the room where she taught sewing. It is not known for what reasons they murdered her in such a macabre way or why they mutilated her body. It is thought that it may be

because the missionary had been fighting against human trafficking relating to the harvesting of organs.

Pope Francis, in a Wednesday audience, said: "I would like to mention today 77-year-old Sister Inés, a teacher of poor girls for many decades, barbarously murdered in the Central African Republic in a place where she taught sewing to the girls. She is another woman who offered her life for Jesus, serving the poor."

It does not seem to be worthy of mention in the news media which is why I decided to dedicate my reflection to this brave woman. Please say a prayer for her soul. Moreover, I have the impression that there is a kind of silent permission for killing Christians in our world. I do not agree with this.
