

Pastoral Reflection by Deacon Matthew Arnold The Gift of Mass Cards



On the occasion of their Fortieth Wedding Anniversary, my parents were thrilled to receive a very special gift from their family. We arranged to have 40 Masses said for their intentions at various churches in several countries. We presented my parents with 40 Mass Cards, detailing the dates and places of the services.

The gift was lovingly offered in thanksgiving for 40 years of their marriage, for their personal intentions (spoken and unspoken) and in recognition of their devotion and service to the Catholic Church. Masses were offered for Patrick and Stella Arnold at St. Patrick's Church and

Stella Maris in Bermuda on the day of their anniversary. My uncles, Fr. Leo and Fr. Gabriel offered Masses in Rome and in Buckfast Abbey, Devon, U.K. respectively. Friends and family members arranged for Masses in the U.K, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Canada, Australia and Ireland.



Some Masses were offered by priests who knew the family. Several were said by men unknown to us; these were arranged by an organization that collected voluntary monetary offerings for Masses celebrated in churches in remote, usually impoverished places. The beauty of the latter is that the offerings were welcomed by the Priests and Catholic communities struggling to make ends meet.

It is a beautiful and prayer-filled gift to have a Mass said for family members on special occasions, such as Birthdays, Wedding Anniversaries and Graduations. Another Nigerian Priest Kidnapped

A Nigerian priest, Rev. Fr. Abraham Kunat, was kidnapped on Tuesday in the Kachia Local Government Area of Kaduna State, northern Nigeria.

A statement signed by the chancellor for the Archdiocese of Kaduna, Father Christian Okewu Emmanuel, said Fr. Kunat was abducted at 12:30 am from St. Mulumba, Kurmin Sara, where he had been residing due to the insecurity situation in the area. Fr. Kunat has been serving as the parish priest of St. Bernard parish, Idon Gida.

The chancellor solicits the prayers and support of the Christian faithful as well as all men and women of goodwill that "God almighty will take control of the situation, preserve our priest and bring him back to us in one piece."



... The last such reported abduction of a priest was on 16 October, when the Archdiocese of Onitsha requested prayers for the safe and unconditional release of Fr. Joseph Igweagu who was kidnapped on 12 October as he was returning to his parish residence after celebrating a Funeral Vigil

Mass in Umunachi, Anambra State.

The Bishop's Corner – Pope Francis on Women's Rights

Dear Fellow-Catholics:

A society that does not give women the same rights and opportunities as men will become impoverished, Pope Francis said at the end of a four-day visit to Bahrain. "Women are a gift," he said. After God made man, he didn't create "a lapdog for him to play with. No, he created two who are equal, a man and a woman. All the rights of women stem from this equality," he said, and a society that is not able to make room for women "does not move forward."


The Pope said, "It is a question of equality, which still has not been universally achieved. Unfortunately, in some places, women are still considered and treated as "second-class" citizens or worse, and we have to keep fighting this. Women are not inferior; they are complementary and this also means women should be bringing their own unique gifts and talents and must not try to be like men. Both must work together: The woman, equal to the man, works for the common good with that insight that women have. I have seen that in the Vatican, every time a woman comes in to do a job in the Vatican, things get better."

The Pontiff also said that, "A society that erases women from public life is a society that becomes impoverished. Equal rights, yes, also equal opportunities, equality in moving forward. There is still a long way to go, because there is so much chauvinism, which "kills humanity". It is also present in the Church. There are people in the Church who do not see things clearly, who do not agree to changes, so it is "a process" that requires courage."

COP27: UN Head Says World on Highway to Climate Hell (By Linda Bordoni, Vatican News online, Nov 7 2022)

On the first day of the UN Climate Summit in Sharm el-Sheikh, the head of the United Nations warned that the world is on a "highway to climate hell with our foot on the accelerator" unless drastic action is taken to curb global warming.

Thus, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres made an impassioned plea to world leaders saying that humanity must "cooperate or perish," and added that rich industrial nations must lead the way. But he noted, emerging economies must also do their bit to bend the global emissions curve, and he called out the world's two biggest emitters, the United States and China, whom, he said, have a particular responsibility....
