#### **BISHOP'S CORNER**

Dear Fellow-Catholics,



The 9th of November marks the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall. On Monday, the 11<sup>th</sup> of November, we have another public holiday to commemorate Remembrance Day which marks the 101st anniversary of the end of the World War I. It is also called "the Great War" because the people of that time thought that it was very cruel and hoped that humanity would not provoke another war again. Unfortunately, twenty years later the Second World War began and it was even more cruel and bloodier than the first one.

I've just read an interview that former Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev gave the BBC in connection with the anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall. In his opinion, the current tensions between Russia and the West expose the world to a "colossal danger" due to the threat of nuclear weapons. When asked about relations between the West and Russia, Mikhail Gorbachev replied that, as in his time, one can still speak of them in terms of war. "Not cold war anymore, but still a war that can be described as chilly," he said. The last leader of the USSR emphasized that "as long as weapons of mass destruction exist, especially nuclear weapons, the threat to the world is colossal."

He called on all countries to destroy nuclear weapons to save themselves and our planet. "Look at what is happening in different places. There are skirmishes, there is shooting, aircraft and ships are being sent here, there and everywhere. This is not the situation we want", emphasized Gorbachev.

In his opinion, fears of the nuclear arms race resuming have increased since the United States and the Russians withdrew this year from the medium-range nuclear forces treaty signed by Gorbachev and US President Ronald Reagan in 1987.

Of course, we as ordinary people have no influence on the great world of politics. However, let's remember that even the biggest conflicts start with small disputes and divisions. Therefore, let us do everything to build peace and unity in our families, communities, organizations and society.
