### BISHOP'S CORNER

My Dear Fellow-Catholics,

My last week's trip to Poland was very long, due to the layovers in the various airports. One of the phenomena I observed during that time was the significantly smaller number of people reading in contrast to the vast majority of people devoted entirely to social media or, people wandering around not knowing what to do with themselves; hence, the topic that I am sharing with you today.

Literature influences humankind through a presentation of a view of the world that is similar to the author. In addition, it offers patterns of thinking, experiences and behaviour. Thanks to literature, we not only know more about the world and other people, but also better understand their attitudes and cultures. Literature has a huge share in personality development, creates personal resources and can compensate for any shortages in meeting our needs. It helps to maintain emotional balance; it can protect against negative emotions, such as sadness, regret, fear, anger. One could say that it plays a therapeutic role in one's life.

The largest library of ancient times located in Alexandria, had a motto "Medicine for the mind." In 1272, the Koran, read as therapy, was used in the Al-Mansur hospital in Cairo. In Europe, in the eighteenth century, reading was included in programs for the treatment of persons with mental or personality disorders. There is even the concept of bibliotherapy, i.e. therapy by reading, which is often used in the treatment of cases of depression. A good book helps to develop the vocabulary that we use and is a great tool for developing our imagination which appears to be experiencing a great crisis in our time.

I realize that we have less and less free time, but I strongly Encourage this everyday exercise of our intellect, even for a short time, through the reading of a good book.
