Dear Fellow-Catholics,

“The Telegraph” published a news article about a group of men in Japan who organized a protest march on Valentine's Day, complaining that the event is a cynical money-making ploy. The group, known as Kakuhido, (that translates roughly as “the Revolutionary Alliance of Men which Women find Unattractive”), marched for an hour and a half through Tokyo's Shibuya district.

“The blood-soaked conspiracy of Valentine's Day, driven by the oppressive chocolate capitalists, has arrived once again,” announced Kakuhido on its website. Kakuhido took to the streets to voice its anger against the commercialized festival of giving chocolates to members of the opposite sex. It should be noted that in Japan, only the women give to the men on the 14th of February, with men reciprocating exactly one month later on so-called White Day.

The group's organizers have provided their foot soldiers with a list of approved chants which include: “Crush Valentine's Day!”, “Do not be fooled by chocolate capitalism” and “Flirting is terrorism - wage war on terrorism!” “All the mass media does is dehumanize those who are not in love,” stated one of the leaders of the group. “It makes them worthless. But the love the mass media is talking about is actually commercial love. They are using love to turn people into consumers.”

No doubt this is quite a strange initiative and action that might (and maybe even should) make us laugh. However, the observation that love is not a product to consume and should never become “commercial” is very valid. Celebrating with cards, chocolates, flowers etc. on Valentine's Day is good, but expressing love daily with simple but beautiful gestures of nearness, care, tenderness, and responsibility means so much more. VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT FOR THE SOUP RUN PROGRAM

For a number of years the Diocese has been assisting the Salvation Army with its outreach program of providing food to the homeless in the city of Hamilton and surrounding areas – otherwise known as the Soup Run. The Diocese helps on Monday, Tuesday and Saturday evenings between the hours of 5pm and 7pm. Volunteers meet at Harbour Lights (the Salvation Army's premises at the junction of Victoria and King Streets) at 5pm to make up sandwiches and then distribute the sandwiches and soup around Hamilton and surrounding areas. Volunteers work in teams of four and operate in a roster whereby each team is normally "on" once every four weeks. We are looking for new volunteers to help with this worthwhile and rewarding program. Supplies are provided and so the only "outlay" for volunteers is the actual time commitment.
