

Take Your Pick

The vast array of possibilities in today's world is both an extraordinary advantage because it can so enrich life and a bewildering encumbrance as we face weighty decisions. Many think that life in the past was less complicated. It might have seemed that way, but women and men have always had to face the same fundamental questions: What is life all about? To what shall I commit myself? And answering such questions has seldom been easy.

Today's first reading underscores the importance of discernment or wisdom as we search for answers. It insists that such discernment or wisdom outstrips riches, or even health, as the goal to which we should strive. It further assures us that in our striving for wisdom we will discover that she does not come to us alone. Rather, she brings all good things with her.

The Gospel passage tells of a young man in search of true meaning, of wisdom, of eternal life. Having valued the law and the way of life it offers a believer, he is dissatisfied. He wanted something more satisfying; something deeper. He is still struggling to discover what life is all about, to what he should commit himself. Jesus tells him that he will not find what he is looking for in his riches. Rather, he should commit himself to the welfare of others. Unfortunately, this advice was too much. He went away sad. Even knowing that he was dissatisfied with his wealth, he still would not walk away from it.

BISHOP's CORNER

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

Pope Francis called scientists, experts, and religious leaders to the Vatican for a "Faith and Science" meeting. During the meeting, a Joint Appeal was signed, which is going to be an important voice for the upcoming COP26 Ecological Summit in Glasgow.

In his speech, the Pope encouraged participants to look from the perspective of interdependence and sharing on ecological issues, to act with love and respect for creation, neighbor, oneself, and the Creator. Pope Francis said, "We cannot act alone without one another.

It is imperative that each of us is committed to caring for others and the environment. It is a commitment that will lead to an urgently needed change of direction, and which must also be supported by the faith and spirituality of each of us. This meeting unites so many cultures and spiritualties in a spirit of brotherhood, strengthens the awareness that we are members of one human family. Each of us has our own faith and spiritual tradition, but there are no cultural, political or social boundaries or barriers that could separate us. To shed light on this vision, we need to commit to a future shaped by interdependence and co-responsibility."

Pope Francis referred to the challenge that calls us to oppose a culture of rejection that seems to dominate our society, and which is based on "the seeds of conflict; greed, indifference, ignorance, fear, injustice, insecurity and violence". He also called for mutual respect between faith and science in order to establish a dialogue aimed at taking care of nature, defending the poor and building a network of brotherhood."

The Pope reminded all the COP26 summit in Glasgow was called to urgently propose effective responses to the unprecedented ecological crisis and the crisis of values in which we live, and to offer concrete hope to future generations. "We want to accompany it with our commitment and through our spiritual closeness," assured the Pope.

On this day in 1917, Our Lady made her promised appearance to three shepherd children as well as a huge crowd of 70,000 believers and unbelievers at Fatima in Portugal. Referred to as "The Miracle of the Sun", all the people present that day were mesmerized by a dancing, colourful sun. Our Lady appeared to the children and called for daily rosary and turning away from sin.

Dear Padre,

I've been married to a Catholic for fifty years and would like to become Catholic. My parish's Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults runs from September through Easter. That's a long time for someone in her eighties. Is there any way to accelerate the process?

RCIA was designed to meet the needs of two main groups: those who have been baptized as Catholics or in a Protestant tradition but have received no additional instruction in the Catholic faith, and those who have



not been baptized. Someone in the first group has a different starting point from someone who has little knowledge of Christ or who has never participated in a church community.

RCIA programs use an instruction process called catechumenate, in which people seeking to become Catholic (catechumens) experience a worshiping community, pray, and reflect on God's word. The catechumenate is divided into steps that are marked by liturgical rites;

some parts of the rites are optional, depending on each catechumen's pastoral situation. Catechumens can be received into the Church at any time of year.

Talk to your pastor about your closeness to Catholicism since your marriage and how it has formed your faith. Together, you can determine the amount and type of preparation that's right for you.
