PARISH Pastor's Note

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday (the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord) marks the end of the Christmas season. Jesus get baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan, and three things happen: the heavens open, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus in the semblance of a dove and the voice of the Father declares Jesus as His Son. The opening of heaven reveals to us the possibility of projecting life in the eternity, to discover that we need to look at the heaven to find the deep meaning of what is happening to us on earth. The Holy Spirit anoints Jesus as the Messiah, as the New Moses who will lead the people of God (those who believe in Him) in a new Exodus crossing the water of death and bringing us into the resurrection. Then we can hear the voice of the Father who tells us: "You are my son, the beloved." If heavens open and through the Spirit we have crossed already with Jesus into the resurrection, then God manifests already himself as our Father. If we are locked into this world, a good many things that happen to us and to the world do not make sense. Suffering, pain, and death can easily lead us to doubt the love of God, that He is acting as a loving father. However, from the vantage point of the Resurrection and eternal life, we can connect the dots and discover the true meaning of the events of life: that pain is a necessary passage to selfless love and eternal fulfillment, that death is the door to the resurrection, that light can only follow after darkness. Then we see that God has loved us all throughout our journey of life, as a merciful tender father, who wants for us what we want the most: that we may be whole, fulfilled, eternal, and become like Him, who is love in the most pure and absolute form.

Bishop's Corner

Dear Fellow Catholics:

Last year Pope Francis established a third Sunday in Ordinary Time as a Sunday of the Word of God. Francis issued this directive as a result of his intention to set aside "a Sunday given over entirely to the Word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people." This year the Sunday of the Word of God occurs on the 24th of January. As I was reflecting about how we could celebrate it, taking into consideration the present situation of COVID-19, I thought that it would be interesting and beneficial to organize a Bible Marathon. On Saturday, 23rd of January 2021, at St. Patrick's Church in Smith's, from 8:00am to 4:00pm there will a continuous reading of the books of the New Testament. We will begin with the Gospels, i.e. the Gospel of Matthew, and will continue until time will allow us. Every person who would volunteer to join the initiative will be asked to read for 15 minutes, beginning at the point in which his/her predecessor in reading would end. The entire reading will also be live-streamed on our Facebook. On Monday, the 11th of January, a Sign-Up list will be made available on-line and announced on our Facebook page. I hope that this initiative will be of interest and will encourage us to know better our Holy Book as well as to be inspired by the Word of God.
