Pastoral Reflection

"Candles: Light That Speaks"

Many Catholics light candles at every Mass but have never stopped to ask, why?

Why do we place candles on the altar? Why do we light them beside the tabernacle, before sacred images, and after the Mass? Because a candle is not a decoration, it is a sermon in flame.

Every candle that burns in the Church says something. It speaks the language of sacrifice. It says, "To give light, I must let myself be consumed."

The candle burns quietly, without complaint, giving everything until nothing remains. That's what love looks like. That's why the Church surrounds her worship with light, not to impress the eyes, but to remind the soul what true holiness costs.

In the early Church, candles symbolized the presence of Christ, "the Light of the world." At every Mass, their glow reminds us that darkness has already been defeated. And when they burn beside the tabernacle, they whisper to us: "He is here."

The candle's wax, pure and white, represents Christ's spotless body. The wick stands for His soul. And the fire represents His divine nature, burning in love until death.

When you light a candle before a statue or an image, you are not lighting it "for luck." You are joining your prayer to that flame, letting it continue to speak before God even after you've gone. The candle keeps praying when your words fall silent.

So, the next time that you see the candles flickering on the altar, remember that they are not there to decorate the sanctuary; they are there to impart the light of Christ.

The Bishop's Corner – Princess Catherine on Attentive Relationships

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

In a recent essay published by the *Centre for Early Childhood*, Catherine, Princess of Wales, reflected on what she calls the most precious yet hardest gift to give: our undivided attention.

It sounds simple, even ordinary, but as the Princess points out, in a world that never stops scrolling, being truly present has become a rare act of love. It's a reflection that many parents struggle with today. In fact, while many end up feeling dissatisfied and full of guilt, they can't help but succumb to the lure of the screen. Interestingly, the British royal observes a modern paradox: We've never been more "connected," yet so often feel alone. She notes that even when we're with the people we love, our minds are elsewhere, lost in a screen, a worry, or a to-do list.

She draws on research from the long-running *Harvard Study of Adult Development*, which found that the greatest predictor of happiness and health isn't wealth or success, but the quality of our relationships. Yet genuine relationships require attention, and attention takes practice. "We are all guilty of being half-present," she admits, "and yet it is through genuine connection that children and adults alike flourish."

The Princess' essay ends with a gentle challenge, one that feels especially timely: If we want a more compassionate world, we can start by giving our full attention to the person right in front of us.
