

Leprosy causes people to suffer twice. Firstly, from the disease, and secondly from being shunned by society. If untreated, leprosy causes disfigurement and immense disability. There is also a huge psychological and emotional toll for patients and their families.



John Bradburne is the man in the above photo wearing a Franciscan habit, attending to a lady with advanced leprosy, at Mutemwa Leprosy Centre in Zimbabwe. I met John several times during my childhood. He dedicated his life to the care of people with the illness. He was brutally murdered in 1979. The church has declared him a "Servant of God," and his cause is being investigated for sainthood.

John's prayerful life of service to people abandoned by society has been recognised by many. I have heard many wonderful testimonies to him at a recent meeting in London.

There will be a FREE public Town Hall on the topic of Youth Mental Health, specifically focusing on self-harm and violence on social media, taking place

on Wednesday, October 15 from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at Bermuda College in Room G301. This event will include sensitive discussions about self-harm and the impact of harmful content on social media which may be emotionally challenging for some attendees, and if at any point the content becomes distressing, it's perfectly okay to step away or take a break – your wellbeing comes first. A licensed psychologist will be onsite throughout the event to provide support if needed. Attendees will also receive evidence-based guidelines adapted for Bermuda that offer practical tools for young people, parents, and educators to have safe and effective conversations about self-harm and mental health. The Bishop's Corner - Dilexi te

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

On the 9th of October, an apostolic exhortation, *Dilexi te ("I have loved you")*, was made public. This document, that is the first magisterial text of Pope Leo's pontificate, focuses on love for the poor. The 9th of October is also the feast day of St. John Henry Newman, who Pope Leo has named as the doctor of the Church.

Pope Francis had been working on the text during the last months of his pontificate, placing this exhortation in the continuity of his last encyclical, *Dilexit nos* ("He loved us"). That last document focused on devotion to the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus. The Argentine pontiff thus sought to highlight the link between spiritual roots and social commitment: From the experience of God's love for us, to the awareness of God's love for our neighbour, and how that must determine our behaviour toward them.

With *Dilexi te*, Leo XIV thus follows in the footsteps of Pope Francis, paying tribute to the man who never ceased to call for "a poor Church for the poor." By publishing his last, unfinished words, he is, in a sense, delivering his predecessor's magisterial testament.

Pope Leo XIV explained that he chose this name in order to "give more attention to social issues in the world, and to questions of justice, in a world radically changed by the development of artificial intelligence."

While *Dilexi te* is an apostolic exhortation, Pope Leo XIV's first encyclical, which is expected to focus on contemporary anthropological challenges, is due to be published in the coming months.
