## Pastoral Reflection

### *"Catechesis and The Purpose & Identity of a Catechist"*

To understand what catechesis is and who exactly is a catechist, let's break it down, step by step:

**First, what's catechesis?** The word catechesis is derived from the Greek word *katecheo* meaning "to echo" – to echo Christ, to echo the Apostles, to echo the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraph 4 states: *"Catechesis is an education in the faith of children, young people and adults which includes especially the teaching of Christian doctrine imparted, generally speaking, in an organic and systematic way, with a view to initiating the hearers into the fullness of Christian life."* Catechesis is NOT about long theories, throwing quotations around, arguing with people, or impressing others with knowledge. It is about helping others to know, love, follow and remain with Jesus. It is walking with them until their faith becomes stronger, their prayer becomes deeper, their understanding becomes clearer, and their life begins to show the light of Christ. The General Directory for Catechesis paragraph 67 states: *"Catechesis must lead to a profound conversion to Christ."* Catechesis is not noise, opinion, pride, or debate. It is service, guidance, and love in action.

**Second, what's the goal of catechesis?** Catechesis is successful when people change because of God's Word and the Church teachings. Paragraph 1697 of the Catechism states: *"Catechesis has to reveal in all clarity the joy and the demands of the way of Christ... for the 'newness of life' in him should be... a catechesis of the Christian virtues of faith, hope and charity..."* A good catechist aims for conversion not entertainment, understanding not confusion, holiness not popularity, spiritual growth not arguments. During Pope Paul VI's 1975 Evangelii Nuntiandi, he stated: *"The Church exists to evangelize, and evangelization is an authentic transformation of things, of hearts, of minds, of wills, which results in the gift of a new life."*

**Third, who is a catechist?** A catechist is not a classroom position. It is a calling. Catechists are witnesses – people who see Christ in their life. They are teachers that explain the faith, companions that walk with those they teach, defenders that protect the truth, servants of the Church that teach what the Church teaches, missionaries that bring others to Jesus. Paragraph 220 in the General Directory for Catechesis states: *"The catechist speaks in the name of the Church,"* which means the Church gives catechists the right to speak in her name only when they echo her teachings faithfully. When catechists are humble, obedient, and faithful to Church teachings, their voices carry weight, their words form souls, and they change lives. Paragraph 238 states: *"Catechists are witnesses and teachers... called to serve the Church's mission."* Therefore, a catechist's authority is simple but firm. It does NOT come from age, personal ideas, or experiences. It comes from the Church.

***You do not need a degree to be a good catechist. You need a heart that listens before it teaches. Thank you to all of our catechists of St. Patrick's Parish! You are appreciated!***

## The Bishop's Corner – Diaconate Ordination

Dear Fellow-Catholics,

Ten years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2016, three men from our Catholic community, Matthew Arnold, Andrew Moulder and David Swain, were ordained permanent deacons for our Diocese. The diaconate programme was initiated during Bishop Kurtz's tenure, and I had the privilege of completing it. It was a special moment for me as well, as it was the first ordination I administered as bishop. After ten years, Deacon Matthew continues to minister, mainly at St. Patrick's, while Deacon Andrew and Deacon David, following their families, have moved overseas. They continue to serve the Church in the places where they now live.

In recent years, there have been a number of enquiries about whether our Diocese might begin a new programme for the permanent diaconate. I believe this anniversary provides a good opportunity to consider the question in a broader context: should we prepare new permanent deacons, or should we focus on preparing lay pastoral leaders? There is no doubt that increasing the number of accurately trained pastoral assistants would be beneficial for our parishes.

The general rule is that the number of permanent deacons in a diocese should not exceed 50% of the number of priests ministering there. In our case, this limit could be accommodated relatively easily, as two of our deacons serve elsewhere; nevertheless, we would not be able to invite more than two candidates into the programme.

If we opt to prepare deacons, candidates must be men and must hold Bermudian citizenship or permanent resident certificate (PRC) status. If, however, we choose to prepare lay pastoral leaders, the invitation could be extended to women and expatriates as well.

While lay pastoral leaders would not be ordained ministers, we could still clearly define the scope of their ministry, enabling them to serve our parishes pastorally in an effective and meaningful way.

I would be very grateful to receive your feedback, my Good People, as this is your Diocese, and I am your bishop only for a certain time.

May your weekend be restful and your week blessed.
