

Pastoral Reflection by Deacon Matthew Arnold

"Good Shepherd Sunday"

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, I reflect on some of the highlights from a homily by Pope Francis in 2016, in which he addressed several hundred priests in St. Peter's Square.

He emphasized that priests must be joyful, stubborn shepherds who take risks and seek out even those who are most distant from God, in imitation of the Good Shepherd Jesus Christ.

"A shepherd after the heart of God has a heart sufficiently free to set aside his own concerns. For the flock he is a shepherd, not an inspector, and he devotes himself to the flock with all he has."

"In seeking, he finds, and he finds because he takes risks. He does not stop when disappointed and he does not yield to weariness." The Pope continued, "Not only does he keep his doors open, but he also goes to seek out those who no longer wish to enter them."

"The Heart of the Good Shepherd tells us that his love is limitless. This heart also reaches out to those who are most distant."

For the pontiff, the fundamental question of priestly life is "Where is my heart directed?" He noted the activities of a priest's life, including catechesis, liturgy, works of charity, and pastoral and administrative commitments.

"The heart of the priest is a heart pierced by the love of the Lord," the Pope declared. "For this reason, he no longer looks to himself, but is turned towards God and his brothers and sisters. His is a heart rooted firmly in the Lord, warmed by the Holy Spirit, open and available to our brothers and sisters."

He encouraged priests to seek out people, to include them, and to rejoice. The priest does not wait for compliments but reaches out to others and rejects gossip, judgments and malice. He generously sows God's forgiveness.

"He does not scold those who wander off or lose their way, but is always ready to bring them back and to resolve difficulties and disagreements," the Pope said.



World Day of Prayer for Vocations

A vocation is how God calls us to serve Him. This Sunday, May 11, we observe the 62nd Annual World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Let us pray for our young

men and women to be inspired and respond to God's call to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life. The Lord also calls us to marriage and family life... how fitting to remember on this Mother's Day weekend. Let us also therefore pray for those who are called to these vocations, and that we may all be granted the grace to hear and answer whenever God calls.

Feast of Our Lady of Fatima

May 13 is the anniversary of the apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in the village of Fatima, Portugal in 1917. A woman all in white presented herself to the children asking them to pray and devote



themselves to the Holy Trinity, and to say the Rosary every day in order to bring peace to the world and an end to war. The celebration of Our Lady of Fatima will be on Tuesday, May 13 at 7:30 p.m. at St. Patrick's, starting with a candlelight procession and recitation of the Rosary in Portuguese, followed by Mass. As Bishop is away, the Mass will be celebrated in English this year by Fr. Vivien.

Welcome, Pope Leo XIV



On Thursday, May 8, shortly after 6:00 p.m. local time in Rome, white smoke appeared from the chimney of the Sistine Chapel, signaling to the world that we had a new pope. Cheers erupted in St.

Peter's Square as the 133 cardinal electors (the largest college in history) came to a two-thirds consensus in their fourth ballot of the conclave. Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, aged 69 from the United States, was announced as the 267th pope, choosing the name of Leo XIV. Born on September 14, 1955 in Chicago, IL, Prevost was raised in a devout Catholic family and drawn to religious life at an early age. After joining the Order of St. Augustine in 1977, he made his solemn vows in 1981. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from Villanova University, followed by a Licentiate and a Doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. He spent over two decades in Chiclayo in Peru serving as a pastor, professor, and formation director for Augustinian seminarians. From 2001 to 2013, he served as Prior General of the Order of St. Augustine, responsible for guiding the worldwide Augustinian order. In 2014, Pope Francis appointed Prevost as the Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Chiclayo, and shortly thereafter named him Bishop. In this role, he became known for fostering vocations, promoting social justice, and strengthening clergy formation. Most recently, Prevost held the position of Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops, which oversees the appointment of bishops worldwide. In September 2023, Pope Francis made him a Cardinal-Deacon, and in February 2025, he was elevated to Cardinal-Bishop. Prevost is considered a theological moderate, deeply aligned with the pastoral and missionary emphasis of his predecessor. His fluency in English, Spanish, Italian and French will enable him to effectively engage with the international Church, and his humility, affability and spiritual depth has already earned him the respect of bishops and clergy worldwide. Prevost was seen as one of Pope Francis' most trusted collaborators, especially in advancing reforms within the global Church. During his speech, he thanked Pope Francis and focused on the message of peace, saying "May we all build bridges with dialogue... so that we can all be one people in peace." May the Lord grant our new Holy Father wisdom, strength and compassion as he leads the Church into this new chapter! God bless you, Pope Leo XIV!


