

Pastoral Reflection by Deacon Matthew Arnold Deceased Fathers

On this Father's Day, I remember and honour my late father. My parents' Wedding Anniversary often coincided with Father's Day, so we as a family would have a double celebration. There are many quotes about fathers. I like this one, by Harmon Killbrew:

"My father used to play with my brother and me in the yard. Mother would come out and say, 'You're tearing up the grass'; Dad would reply; 'We're not raising grass, we're raising boys.'

When we lose a father, it hurts. We want to ask him one more question, tell him one more thing, or ask for one more "loan". We may think of the times we disappointed our Dads, or when they caused dismay in our fragile lives.

I have some suggestions for easing the pain we feel on this Father's Day, in the absence of our fathers.

- **Spend some time with Dad**. Write him a letter; pray for him; visit his grave and talk to him. Tell him how much you love him, and tell him about things that are happening in your life today.

- <u>Have a Mass intention in his memory.</u> This is a wonderful Catholic tradition to honour the deceased. Invite family and friends to the Mass.

- <u>Look at photographs, letters, videos.</u> Laugh at his Dad jokes, enjoy his Dad dancing and celebrate his quirky behaviour.

- <u>**Talk about your Dad.</u>** To your children, your wife, your friends; in fact, tell everyone about your Dad. Keep his memory alive.</u>

- **<u>Forgive.</u>** Dads are like us - imperfect. Take some time to forgive him for the things he did not get right, and ask him for forgiveness for the times that you know, in your heart, that you failed to be the best you could be.

On Saturday, June 19, Fr. Vladimir celebrates his 45th Anniversary of Ordination.

He was ordained a priest of the Congregation of the Resurrection in Poland forty-five years ago. He then served for two years as an Associate Pastor in Poznan, Poland, before moving to Australia where he lived for twenty-two years and served as a Pastor in both Adelaide and Melbourne. Fr. Vladimir was installed as the Pastor of St. Michael's Parish, Paget, on June 25, 2000, and was then transferred to St. Patrick's Parish on August 15, 2012. Additionally, Fr. Vladimir is the Vicar General of the Diocese of Hamilton Bermuda.

We congratulate him on his forty-five years of priesthood and pray that God continues to bless him and his ministry to our Church.

The Bishop's Corner – Fatherhood

My Dear Fellow-Catholics:

Fabrice Hadjadj, French philosopher, playwright and convert, father of nine children, and past member of the Pontifical Council for the Laity, expresses to the *Famille Chrétienne* weekly newspaper about his latest book, *Etre père avec Saint Joseph: Petit guide de l'aventurier des temps post-modernes* - Being a father with St. Joseph: A small guide for the adventurer in the postmodern era.

Hadjadj talks about the crisis of fatherhood, but makes an observation that the most problematic models and stereotypes of fatherhood and parenthood in general, are collapsing today. So it does not necessarily have to be lamented. Looking for designs in the figure of St. Joseph, however, needs to be freed from excessively superficial and unreal ideas about him. It has come to the point that the family in which the Incarnation took place is often seen as the most disincarnated family.


He notes that in the biblical world, fatherhood, or the family in general, is not just a well-functioning mechanism, but an adventure that has its ups and downs. Parents are not primarily educators but those who hand over life with all that it brings. So the basic issue is accepting that we live because to live is to react to an event. For a man, fatherhood is the first and strongest adventure. Birth is a happy event, admits the French philosopher, and yet a being emerges who will suffer and have to confront injustice. "My child is exposed to evil and I agreed to it, and I am responsible for this vulnerability. How do I not experience a crisis in this situation? It must be remembered that in life, here on earth, joy and anguish, fullness and poverty always grow together."

Fabrice Hadjadj, who grew up in a Jewish family before his conversion to Catholicism, reminds us that in the biblical tradition a child is not one who simply obeys the law, but enters the living Word and traditions passed on to him by his parents. Today there is a danger of seeing parents as parenting experts who are not simply supposed to receive their children but to produce an excellent child that will not make mistakes. Meanwhile, even in Paradise, where the Father was perfect, "the fall" happened. When, on the other hand, as in the case of Jesus, the child is perfect, it does not mean that sometimes he will not get lost and cause his parents to fear. It is normal for a child to elude his parents. "Parenting is not an application," concludes Hadjadj.
